# More or Less Game

I can compare numbers.





#### **Instructions**

This is a game for 2 players.

#### You will need:

1 game board per player1 dice12 interlocking cubes

## How to play:


- Each player needs a game board.
- Player 1 rolls the dice and builds a tower with that many cubes.
- Player 2 rolls the dice and builds a tower with that many cubes.
- Both players then compare towers and decide how many more or fewer cubes are in each tower. How much is the difference between the two towers?
- Both players then check to see if they have the number that matches the
  difference on their game board. If they have that number on their board,
  they cover the number and say a sentence about the number, e.g. a
  player might cover number 2 and say "6 is 2 more than 4" or "4 is 2 less
  than 6".
- Both players then roll again and build and compare two more towers.
- First to cover all their numbers is the winner.

Use a paperclip, held in place by the tip of your pencil placed on the white dot in the middle of the spinner. To choose a number, hold the pencil and spin the paperclip.





#### **Instructions**

This is a game for 2 players.

#### You will need:


1 game board per player
1 spinner per player
1 paperclip per player
1 pencil per player
16 interlocking cubes

#### How to play:

- Each player needs a game board and a spinner.
- Player 1 spins their spinner and builds a tower with that many cubes.
- Player 2 spins their spinner and builds a tower with that many cubes.
- Both players then compare towers and decide how many more or fewer cubes are in each tower. How much is the difference between the two towers?
- Both players then check to see if they have the number that matches the difference on their game board. If they have that number on their board, they cover the number and say a sentence about the number, e.g. a player might cover number 2 and say "6 is 2 more than 4" or "4 is 2 less than 6".
- Both players then spin again and build and compare two more towers.
- First to cover all their numbers is the winner.







Use a paperclip, held in place by the tip of your pencil placed on the white dot in the middle of the spinner. To choose a word, hold the pencil and spin the paperclip.

#### **Instructions**

This is a game for 2 players.

#### You will need:

1 recording sheet
1 spinner
1 paperclip
1 pencil
Interlocking cubes

## How to play:

- Each player grabs a handful of cubes without counting.
- Each player counts to see how many cubes they have and makes a note of the number.
- Both players decide how many more and how many less one number is than the other. How much is the difference between the two numbers?
- A player then spins the spinner. If it lands on 'more', the person whose number is more can record the sentence under their name. If it lands on 'less', the other person takes the turn. First to fill in all their spaces is the winner.
