What you already know?

Pupils will be able to explain how to search for information about others online. They will be able to give examples of what anyone may or may not be willing to share about themselves online. They will be able to explain the need to be careful before sharing anything personal. They know who to ask if they are unsure about putting something online.

What you will learn:

Pupils will be able to search for information about an individual online and summarise the information found. They will be able to describe ways that information about anyone online can be used by others to make judgments about an individual and why these may be incorrect

- Use a search engine to search for information about other people and present that information for others to read
- Understand that the information I find may not be accurate
- Understand that people may make judgements against others on the information that they find

Vocabulary:

Summarise - a brief recollection or account of the main points in a text

Accurate - how close results are to the truth

Search engine - a webpage where you can look up different information

Website - a collection of interlinked web pages, stored under a single domain

Reliable - trusted and dependable

Reputation - the general belief or opinion that other people have about you or a thing.
