*To talk about and ask questions about aspects of the world that is familiar to you, such as the place where you live or the natural world.

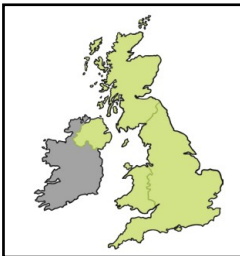
Knowledge of Place:

What you will learn to describe and understand:

Throughout the topic, you will learn:

- *name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas.
- *use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, sea, ocean, season and weather.
- *devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key.
- *use simple compass directions and locational and directional to describe the location of features and routes on a map.
