Vocabulary

Coast	Where the land meets the sea.
Mountains	Areas of land much higher than the land around them. Steeper and higher than a hill.
Sea	A body of saltwater much smaller than an ocean.
River	A moving body of water flowing across the land.
Valley	A long depression or ditch in the Earth's surface
City	The largest kind of settlements and often have millions of people living in them.
Town	A settlement smaller than a city but larger than a village.
Village	A small settlement
Port	A place where boats can come and go to load and unload their supplies/people.
Climate	The long-term pattern of weather in a given area
Weather	A description of what the conditions are like in a particular place.
Tourism	The business of encouraging and supporting tourists.
